Welcome to the Second Star Sailing! In these Joining Instructions you will find all necessary information about where to find us, what to expect during your theory or practical sailing course, and a very detailed packing list. This may seem like a long read, but trust us, it's going to be worth your time and hopefully answer all of your questions!

WHERE WE ARE?

We are located at the residential area of Jolly Harbour (not in the marina). Our school has a cozy office and is at the waterfront – with all school boats at our dock.

TRAVELING TO ANTIGUA BY AIR

Jolly Harbour is a 30-minute drive from V.C Bird International Airport (ANU) in Antigua. You can take a taxi directly to Jolly Harbor. Pricing may vary with availability but is usually around \$40USD for a one-way transfer.

ARRIVING BY CAR TO OUR LOCATION

To join us by car from the airport, follow directions to Jolly Harbour, or have the rental car company mark it on a map for you. Please note the roads have many potholes and speed bumps so drive cautiously.

ARRIVING BY CAB TO OUR LOCATION

If you come by cab, it's important to ask them to leave you in front of our door and not just at the marina (otherwise it will be a very long walk). When at the security gate, please tell the villa number — 414A, Second Star Sailing school.

ACCOMMODATION

We don't provide housing for our students on shore before or after the course, nor during shore-based courses. You will be staying on board for the duration of the course if you are taking practical sailing courses from Sunday to Thursday.

During your courses we suggest staying in Jolly Harbour, so you can easily reach the crew house. However, if you are looking for more lively area and night life, you can look for options at Falmouth and English Harbour. Please take in mind that it will be a 45 min drive to the crew house by car, and there are no direct buses.

You can look for accommodation online: booking.com, airbnb.com, google, etc. We suggest booking in advance during high season.

WHAT TO EXPECT?

All our courses start on Sunday unless informed otherwise. We will meet you at the crew house at 09:30 AM the first day of your course.

All our courses finish on Thursday unless informed otherwise. You will be back at the crew house form a practical course not later than 05:00 PM. Theory courses take place at the crew house and will finish by 05:00 PM as well. You are very welcome to stay for our weekly Thursday BBQ!

PRACTICAL COURSES

Accommodation: you will be staying on board from Sunday to Thursday (17:00 PM). Our pricing is per person, based on double occupancy in each cabin. You will be based on a sailboat - space is limited, and cabins have two berths, so double occupancy is expected. Depending on the boat, you will have double berths, bunk beds, or the option to sleep in the saloon. Please enquire for availability and pricing should you prefer single occupancy of a double cabin.

Provisioning: We like to encourage students to collaborate and enjoy preparing and eating meals on board together. Provisioning is not included in your fee and at the beginning of the week everyone will contribute to a kitty that will be used to purchase food/meals to your collective discretion. A contribution to the kitty will be made for the instructor's meals. Basic provisioning is always on board (usually items such as coffee, tea,







spices, etc.) Along with the instructor, a schedule will be determined for all to share cooking and cleaning duties.

Depending on each crew's eating habits and meal preferences, total costs of provisioning may vary. Usually, shared provisioning costs around 10-15 USD per person for one day.

Should you have any allergies, chemical sensitivities or dietary restrictions, please be sure to notify us in advance on your medical form as soon as possible so that we can help plan and assist in ensuring you have access to the right kind of products - they might be more difficult to source here in the Caribbean.

Schedule: Our courses begin promptly at 9:30 AM the first day. Unless informed otherwise, sailing tends to be between 9 AM and 5 PM every day, depending on the type of course and instructor's judgment. Some night sailing is included in most courses, the particulars of the night sail(s) are left to the instructors to determine with the students. Please be prepared to be flexible as to your schedule. We will be at anchor or on a mooring 2–3 nights during your course. Most courses end at 4 or 5pm on the last day, after a thorough cleanup of the boat by everyone, and a debrief with your instructor.

THEORY COURSES

Accommodation: you will need to book an accommodation for the duration of you course. We recommend staying at Jolly Harbour from Sunday to Thursday (during the course) – there are many hotels and airbnb, a big grocery store, restaurants and bars, several beaches, car and bike rentals.

Provisioning: there is drinking water available at the crew house and an option to make a hot drink throughout the day. Please bring your own pre-cooked lunches and snacks, drinks.

Schedule: Our courses begin promptly at 9:30 AM the first day. Unless informed otherwise, theory courses tend to be between 9 AM and 5 PM every day, with a lunch break and a few coffee breaks.

PACKING LIST

Basic personal sailing kit for a 5-day RYA practical course in the Caribbean includes the following.

- required
- suggested

The list is in no particular order

- Shoes: non-skid, light soled or non-marking closed toe sneakers or sailing shoes - you will not be allowed to sail barefoot
- Waterproof/windproof jacket & trousers: basically light wet weather gear
- A sun hat/cap with a retaining strap
- Sunscreen quick drying, and no spray or self-tan, so the boat does not get greasy. Please choose sunscreen that is not damaging to the environment, the ocean, the coral. Ask us for details. Please note-

- Sea sickness medication of your choice. Even if normally you don't get seasick
- Cowl neck sun protector (this can be used as a mask as well)
- Bug spray please, non-toxic! And always only put on outside and don't spray on boat surfaces note that usually there are no bugs while we are sailing
- Swimwear







if your sunscreen stains the lifejackets, we will ask you to clean it off before you leave

- Sunglasses please invest in a pair that protect your eyes from UV rays and retaining strap
- Headlamp or torch with a red light mode for night sailing – if possible, choose the headlamp with red light mode switching on first
- Reusable water bottle not metal if possible, they clank on the boat. Definitely with a carabiner
- A pair of sailing gloves, with or without fingers (can also be gym gloves, bike gloves or similar)
- Sleeping cocoon or light sleeping bag. We provide bottom sheets, pillows and pillowcase
- Small waterproof grab bag for your documents/ essentials - to transfer to shore in the dinghy, they can get - well wet!
- A second set of medication required for the skipper to keep ready for emergency evacuation of the boat
- Bring at least 2 extra passport photos. You will need one for each certificate awarded and one for our files, plus visas/ etc. (for Day Skipper, Coastal Skipper, Yachtmaster coastal/Yachtmaster coastal/ offshore/ocean programs). If you are taking the Radio VHF course please bring an extra photo for your application to the RYA/MCA and a form of Government-issued ID.
- Notebook and writing materials. There are only a few options in Antigua. Bring your favorites!)
- Charting/ navigation kit (plotter, dividers, pencils etc) if you are taking theory courses

- Clothing: 2 pairs of comfortable shorts, preferably quick dry. 1 long pair of trousers, preferably quick dry (not jeans). 3 quick dry short sleeved shirts. 1 long sleeve sport shirt/top also for the sun protection. A light fleece vest/jacket or similar.
- 1 pair of sport quick dry socks if you use them with your sailing shoes
- Lightweight/quick dry towel (we provide one while on board, just in case you would like another one)
- Shore shoes flip flops, sandals, etc. No shore shoes on board!
- Personal items, underclothing, and going onshore/ going out clothing and footwear
- Earplugs /eye covers if you need them to sleep better in close quarters
- Toiletries as a green business we prefer if you could bring personal products which are biocompatible and/or biodegradable/non-toxic
- Electrics underway we have a USB port and 12 volt chargers available. When connected to shore, we run standard Italian plugs and voltage on the boat. Antigua runs on 220/110 depending, with USA plugs or a cable to your phones etc. if you have a power bank or solar charger, you are welcome to bring that as well
- Personal Logbook if you have one. We suggest you always keep one. We have RYA Syllabus & Logbook (G158) for sale at the office
- Utility tool or knife such as a leatherman or a Gerber.

GEAR

Please remember that on board we cannot stow hard suitcases, only soft sided bags. Should you not have a soft suitcase or duffle bag, we can keep it in storage at the Crew House for the duration of your trip. Pack as lightly as you can. It is warm and lovely in the Caribbean most of the time (isn't this why you are coming?!) but at sea it can get chilly in the evenings or during a "liquid sunshine" episode...

We have safety equipment for everyone onboard but you are welcome to bring your own so long as it is suitable.

STUDY MATERIALS

We have a full set of RYA books, materials, and logbooks that you can purchase. Shipping to the Caribbean is costly, so purchasing at home may be less expensive. Let us know if you are unsure what you need.







INSURANCE

We highly recommend you take out travel insurance such as global blue or topsail to cover your activities on the water. Please look into what coverage you might have with your local companies as they will differ with your nationality, residence and sailing area.

DOCUMENTS

Please check visa requirements relevant to your nationality for Antiga and other islands that you may visit during your course.

CURRENCY

The currency in Antigua is the Eastern Caribbean Dollar. You can pay in either currency but will always have change in EC. There are a few ATMs in Jolly Harbour as well as a bank. US dollars are accepted pretty much everywhere.

DRUGS, ALCOHOL, SMOKING AND CONDUCT POLICY

Our policy is that no illegal drug or banned substance use is permitted during our courses. We will ask you to leave the course or cruise should you be found under the influence or in possession of such substances/drugs.

We do not allow smoking on board our vessels. You may smoke when ashore, but on board you will be limited to vaping, always outside, and with the permission of your skipper/instructor.

Alcohol may be consumed by all persons of legal drinking age by direct permission of your instructor or skipper at the end of the sailing day, when the boat is secure and your active participation is complete. Should you be found to be intoxicated at any time you should be or while you are on a watch system, you will be removed from active participation in the course.

COMPLAINTS PROCEDURES

Please contact the school principal with any issues. Should the issue not be resolved with the school principal during an RYA course, you may also contact the RYA directly.
